Vestry Highlights - July 21, 2013



The minutes of the June 30, 2013 meeting were approved and the Treasurer's report for June, 2013 was accepted as printed.

The Vestry voted to purchase oil this heating season for all three churches through the budget plan. Budget amount for all 3 churches: \$1,878.00 per month.

Two dehumidifiers have been connected at Christ Church. The boiler at St. John's has been inspected.

A grant application for Prayer Books and Bibles will be sent to the Advancement for the Society of Episcopal Churches along with a donation of \$150.

A luncheon will be served on October 6 following the combined service of North Parish at Holy Apostles at 11:00 a.m. where Dan Charney will speak on stewardship. Please read the stewardship letter included in this newsletter.

The Annual Meeting will be held at Christ Church on October 20th. The combined service of North Parish will be held at 11:00 a.m. followed by a pot luck dinner and the annual meeting.

Next Vestry Meeting will be held August 18th at Christ Church.

NEWS FROM THE MARION C. PRICE TRUST FUND

Scam Alert! – Recently you might have received a notice that you may qualify for the Funeral Advantage Program that will pay your family in the event of your death an insurance cash benefit up to \$20,000 TAX FREE. <u>DO NOT REPLY</u>

As you probably have guessed it is a scam, the information that they ask you to provide such as name, age and phone number goes to a data processing center whose sole purpose is to provide customer's addresses, phone numbers, etc to businesses, thus putting you right back on their call list.

Insurance -The Affordable Car Act helped create a competitive private health insurance market through the creation of Health Insurance Marketplaces or Exchanges, which launch in 2014, will provide millions of Americans and small businesses with "one-stop shopping" for affordable coverage. All marketplaces will launch open enrollment October 1, 2013. Coverage will start as soon as January 1, 2014.

The Marketplace is a new way to find health coverage that fits your budget and meets your needs. It should simplify your search for health coverage by gathering the options available in your area in one place. With one application you can compare plans based on price, benefits, quality and other features important to you before you make a choice.

Medicare – The Fall Open Enrollment Period will soon be upon us. This is the time of year you can change your Medicare coverage. It is the period from October 15th - December 7th. Plans can change how they cover your care each year. This means that pharmacy and provider networks can change, costs can change and drugs covered by the plan's formulary can change.

Even If you like your current Medicare coverage and want to continue with that plan, you should carefully read your annual notice of change from your plan to make sure the plan still features the coverage you like.

If you decide to change plans, make sure your doctors, hospitals and pharmacies are in the network and most importantly that the plan covers your drugs.

Medicare Doughnut Hole- coverage will be changing in 2014. When someone is in the doughnut hole, they will have greater discounts than in previous years. After you spend \$2,970 you reach the gap or doughnut hole. While you are in this gap you will pay 47 ½% for most brand name drugs and 79% for generics. After you have spent \$4,750 out of pocket, you will leave the doughnut hole and you will pay \$2.65 for generics and \$6.60 for brand name drugs.

Senior Adventures – It is not too late to join us on our adventures for 2013. September 26th we will be traveling to the Creekside Restaurant in Ringtown, October 24th the Sand Spring Golf Club in Drums and November 21st the Red Lion Restaurant in Pine Grove.

Operation We Care – mailing took place in May earlier this year, to date we have sent over 3600 pounds of personal care items and food goodies to our local servicemen and women stationed in Iraq & Afghanistan. A recent thank you note – "Thank you all for the care packages. We made sure all the soldiers got a little bit of everything in all the boxes. "

Our next mailing will be November 19th. We will be including Christmas items from home that will hopefully make their Christmas away from home a little bit easier.

AARP Safe Driving Refresher Course will be held at Trinity, Thursday, October 17th, 9 AM - 1 PM. A 5-15% auto insurance discount is possible, for attending this course depending on your insurance carrier.

Influenza (FLU) Vaccine – The flu is a contagious disease that spreads around the United States every winter, usually between October and May.

Flu is caused by the influenza virus, and can be spread by coughing, sneezing and close contact.

Flu can make some people much sicker than others. These people include young children, people 65 and older, pregnant women, and people with certain health conditions – such as heart, lung or kidney disease, or a weakened immune system. Flu can lead to pneumonia, and make existing medical conditions worse.

There are two types of flu vaccine, activated and inactivated.

You are getting the inactivated flu vaccine, which does not contain any live influenza virus. It is given by injection with a needle and often called the "flu shot". Inactivated flu vaccine does not contain live flu virus, so getting flu from this vaccine is not possible.

A different, live, weakened influenza vaccine is sprayed into the nostrils.

With a vaccine, like any medicine, there is a chance of side effects. These are usually mild and go away on their own. Serious side effects are always possible, but are very rare.

If you think it is a severe allergic reaction or other emergency that can't wait, call 9-1-1 or get the person to the nearest hospital.
