Musings from the priest's computer....

Although we are not animists (those who believe that living and inanimate objects have spirits which influence humans) —the created order does influence us in many ways. Foggy or misty mornings seem to envelop us, and bring melancholy or introspection, while brilliant sunlight can lift our mood and give energy. Likewise, a beautiful vista gets the heart and mind racing. We are leaving the colors of summer, greens and reds and yellows and purples and blues, for the bronze shades of autumn. The lengthening night times are teasing us as counters to the location of dawn and the associated warmth of sunlight. Our liturgical order is also subtly changing from the Matthean themes of the work of Jesus and his miracles and encompassing more of the coming of the Kingdom of God here and now.

As the autumn days approach quickly, the Church in Schuylkill County is also moving quickly. There will be joint worship, joint exploration of our shared history, teaching and learning opportunities, and of course, liturgical events which call us again and again to pray, and praise, and gather and love one another. These all serve to bring more of us into the participation of and with and for the Body of Christ here. Instruction for those seeking Confirmation or Reception in the Episcopal Church begins the latter part of September—dates to be announced—and these sessions are also a great opportunity to learn and grow your faith while lifting others with your unique experiences and insights.

Autumn also brings us connections with the natural world. Differing smells, changes in vegetation, the starkness of tree bark contrasted with the changing leaves and flowers all are harbingers of the next season. Animals are getting ready as we must also. Readying ourselves for the next church season and readying for differences in the life in our congregations throughout the county may touch us all somehow. As summer slowly—or rather quickly—starts a movement towards autumn, continue to pray for one another in joy and love. Welcome each other as you so ably welcome those unfamiliar to you. And above all, invite others in to watch and pray and participate in the life of the best kept secret in Christianity, the Episcopal Church.

#### September 2023

The most important words to say in Church are "thank you." Say it often, and mean it, and today I say it to you. Thank you for the many gifts that you share with our community.

You have heard the familiar expression "can't see the forest for the trees" before. We most often use it to describe that occasion in which we lose sight of the big picture while focusing on the details. From my position, I often experience the blessing of being able to see the big picture of our congregation – the ministry we bring to our neighbors, the impact we have on our community, the ways that week after week we come together to celebrate our faith and praise God. This is the forest.

And I get to wander amongst the trees. From the small shoot reaching out from its seed and finding the sunlight, to the mightiest tree, standing tall, showing strength, offering sheltering love to those who need it. You are those trees, each drawing strength from our meal and showering the world with the love and grace you have come to know here. I am blessed in that here in our congregation, I can see both the forest and the trees!

When I walk through a forest, I am aware of the tangle of roots, how one tree is connected to another. Trees use these networks, secretly talking to each other through their roots, passing information along. Adult trees share their sugars with young saplings, a dying tree can send its remaining resources back out to help the community. These networks, these roots of abundance, keep trees in place just as much as they free them to grow and share.

The theme of our annual pledge campaign this year is Rooted in Abundance, and we are reminded that we are a mighty forest comprised of ancient trunks and sprightly saplings, each of us contributing our gifts to a world that needs us. As you hear the messages and stories of abundance this year, take note of how generosity spreads and widens our root structures of faith and action.
