From Fr. Tim's Desk

I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?"

John 11:25-26

As we begin the month of April we are still weeks away from Easter Day and here in the waning days of Lent we have one of the passages surrounding the raising of Lazarus from the dead. What is it doing here? Week by week we're in self-examination mode moving somberly toward the death of Jesus on the cross and we come across a life giving Easter sort of story. Why is it not part of the Easter season? It's the wrong time and the wrong place. Shouldn't we wait until Easter? But the reality is that whenever and wherever Jesus shows up, the dead come to life.

As much as the gospel of John emphasizes the divinity of Jesus Christ, the story of Lazarus reveals more about Jesus' humanity. Jesus was not dealing with some abstract or theological concept. Lazarus was a dear friend and when Jesus learned of his death his spirit was shaken and moved. Jesus wept. It was real. It was personal. After he dealt with his emotions Jesus looked toward heaven and thanked his Father for having heard him in his distress and he took charge and he invoked the power of God to raise Lazarus to new life, because he could.

In the midst of our own lives as we struggle with failing bodies or mental health, or hopelessness or despair, or grief or sorrow, or unbelief and unfaithfulness; we who claim the faith of Jesus are reminded that our comfort does not lie is some abstract theological concept. Our comfort lies in the Lord Jesus Christ. His presence is real and personal and now. He hears us in our distress and acts in our lives, because he can. Whenever and wherever Jesus shows up, the dead come to life.

We had a profit of \$500 which was also designated for our General Operating Expenses.

NEWS FROM MARION C. PRICE TRUST FUND

Salt – Do you know the average American eats over 3,000 milligrams of salt a day. Increased sodium (salt) in our diet puts us at a higher risk for heart disease and elevated blood pressure, and even without a salt shaker here and there, our food is brimming with it. The American Heart Association (AHA) recommends limiting sodium intake to less than 1,500 milligrams per day.

The challenges are that 77 % of the salt we consume is already in the prepared foods we eat, people are eating more processed foods, eating out more and eating fewer fresh home cooked meals.

There are six foods that sneak salt into our diets:

- Bread and rolls Most breads will have 100 to 200 milligrams of sodium per slice. Read the labels and find whole-grain bread that has less than 200 milligrams of sodium per serving.
- 2. Cold cuts and cured meats Ham is a particularly high offender. If you indulge in lunch meats, find low-sodium varieties but even those cold cuts marketed as low sodium may be high.
- 3. Pizza Pizza brings together a melting pot of high sodium ingredients. Lessen the blow by choosing olive oil instead of tomato, opt for veggie toppings instead of meat. Limit yourself to two small slices and have a salad or steamed vegetable to round out the meal.
- 4. Poultry –A natural fresh or frozen piece of chicken could be injected with broth or sodium solution preservatives that boost sodium content up to 200 milligrams per serving. When purchasing chicken, avoid any prepared or processed products, which are packed with seasonings and sodium and are often fried. Consider fresh fish to bake or grill as another low-sodium alternative.
- 5. Soup A single serving of canned soup often measures in at 600-1,000 milligrams of sodium per serving (with two servings per can). It helps to choose a lower-sodium variety, but even those can score 400-plus milligrams per cup.
- 6. Sandwiches a sandwich or burger from a fast food restaurant can contain more than 100 % of your daily suggested dietary sodium. BBQ sauce and ketchup add sugar and salt.
