

NEWS FROM MARION C. PRICE TRUST FUND

PACE/PACENET is Pennsylvanian's prescription assistance programs for older adults, offering low-cost prescription medication to qualified residents, age 65 and older. **Effective for 2014** – Social Security Medicare Part B premiums are now excluded from income. To qualify for PACE a single person's income must be \$14,500 or less and for a married couple, combined income must be \$17,700 or less. For PACENET a single person's income can be between \$14,500 and \$23,500 and for a married couple combined income can be between \$17,700 and \$31,500.

Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program benefits eligible Pennsylvanians age 65 and older; widows and widowers age 50 and older and people with disabilities age 18 and older. Homeowners and renters can receive up to \$650 depending on income. When calculating your total eligible annual household income, exclude one-half of your Social Security benefits.

Dietary Fiber: Essential for a healthy diet. Eat more fiber. You've probably heard it before. But do you know why fiber is so good for your health?

Dietary fiber – found mainly in fruits, vegetables, whole grains and legumes – is probably best known for its ability to prevent or relieve constipation. But foods containing fiber can provide other health benefits as well, such as helping to maintain a healthy weight and knowing your risk of diabetes and heart disease.

Dietary fiber, also known as roughage or bulk, includes all parts of plant foods that your body can't digest or absorb. Unlike other food components, such as fats, proteins or carbohydrates – which your body breaks down and absorbs – fiber isn't digested by your body. Instead, it passes relatively intact through your stomach, small intestine, colon and out of your body.

Fiber is commonly classified as:

- Soluble (it dissolves in water) fiber can help lower blood cholesterol and glucose levels. Soluble fiber is found in oats, peas, beans, apples, citrus fruits, carrots and barley.
- Insoluble (it doesn't dissolve) fiber promotes the movement of material through your
 digestive system and increases stool bulk, so it can be of benefit to those who struggle
 with constipation or irregular stools. Whole-wheat flour, wheat bran, nuts, beans and
 vegetables, such as cauliflower, green beans and potatoes are good sources of insoluble
 fiber.

A high-fiber diet has many benefits, which include: normalizing bowel movements, helping to maintain bowel health, lowering cholesterol levels, helping to control blood sugar levels and aiding in achieving a healthy weight. The Institute of Medicine, which provides science-based advice on matters of medicine and health gives the following daily recommendations for men older than 51 - 30 grams and women - 21 grams of fiber.www.mayoclinic.org
