

#### **VESTRY MEETING HIGHLIGHTS - January 15, 2017**

**Thanksgiving Meal** – Approximately 280 meals were served which included 152 deliveries, 57 take outs and 71 people ate at the church. \$992 in donations along with turkeys was received from not only church members but also the community. Expenses totaled \$925.20 leaving a balance of \$66.80. This amount was donated to the Marion Price Trust fund to help to defray the cost of postage for Operation We Care.

Diocesan Trust Funds – North Parish currently has a total of 19 Trust Funds invested with the Diocese totaling approximately \$360,000. Currently each is set up in its own fund. On recommendation of the Diocesan Treasurer, Charlie Barebo, the Trust Funds will be merged into three funds. The sale of all property along with trust funds that were set up to help with the expenses of the church will be merged into the General Trust Fund. The Trust Funds that were designated by the family for Maintenance and Improvement will be merged into the Maintenance and Improvement Trust Fund. And the Sanner Glick Trust Fund will remain a stand-alone fund to be used for altar supplies such as candles, linens, etc. This is being done to have a better rate of return.

**Nativity Set at Holy Apostles** - The week before Christmas, someone smashed Joseph, the Angel and a lamb to our beautiful outdoor Nativity Set. During this terrible time, God has shown his light on HA once again. People from the community have sent donations to repair or replace the set. A parishioner from HA has offered to replace the figures that have been broken or the whole set if need be. We will have a Nativity Set next Christmas, thanks be to God.

#### **NEWS FROM MARION C PRICE TRUST FUND**

Cold season is upon us. The cold is caused by a viral infection in the upper airways, sinuses, throat and nose.

Good hygiene is important to prevent the spread of infection. Cover your mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze and throw it away into a trash can immediately. Make sure you wash your hands with warm water and soap. If you don't have tissues and cough or sneeze, health professionals recommend you do so into the inner part of your elbow, because that part of the body does not contaminate surfaces.

If you catch a cold, you can expect to be sick for one or two weeks. Bear in mind that your cold will most likely go away on its own. If you are suffering with a cold there are a number of things that you can look at to make life easier and more manageable for yourself in the meantime.

- > Stay hydrated. Water, juice, clear broth or warm lemon water with honey helps loosen congestion and prevent dehydration. Avoid alcohol, coffee and caffeinated beverages, which make dehydration worse.
- Rest and stay warm. Your body needs to heal.
- Soothe a sore throat. A saltwater gargle  $-\frac{1}{4}$  to  $\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoon salt dissolved in an 8-oz. glass of warm water can temporarily relieve a sore or scratchy throat.
- ➤ Combat stuffiness. Over-the-counter saline nasal drops and sprays can help relieve stuffiness and congestion.
- Relieve pain. Acetaminophen (Tylenol), Advil or ibuprofen are effective for the treatment of fever or pain.
- ➤ Sip warm liquids. Chicken soup, tea or warm apple juice might be soothing and ease congestion by increasing mucous flow and will keep your throat moist.
- Add moisture to the air. A cool mist vaporizer or humidifier can add moisture to your home, which might help loosen congestion.
- > Try an extra pillow under your head.
- ➤ Use mentholated salve. Try a small dab under your nose to open up breathing passages.
- Try over-the-counter (OTC) cold and cough medications. Decongestants, antihistamines and pain relievers might offer some symptom relief. However, they won't prevent a cold or shorten its duration. *Most have some side effects so please speak with your primary care physician or read labels carefully before starting any OTC medication.*

**Pneumonia** Colds can easily develop into pneumonia in the elderly. It can also be more dangerous for people with chronic diseases, such as lung or cardiac problems.

It should also be noted that older people tend to have fewer symptoms than younger people, meaning that the pneumonia can progress to a dangerous point before medical attention is sought.

Most cases of pneumonia start out with the typical symptoms of a cold - - sneezing, sore throat, runny nose. You may even have a mild cough. Chest pain that feels worse with deep breaths or coughing, may feel like an aching or dull pressure under your breast bone.

Often people with pneumonia feel a general "malaise", which includes achy muscles and discomfort. There can also be joint pain.

Purple or "Dusky" skin color, indicating that not enough oxygen is getting into the blood.

Headaches are often made worse by coughing.

Shortness of breath, clammy skin and shaking chills, low alertness and confusion are also symptoms of pneumonia that you may see.

Responding quickly when any of these symptoms are present in an older person may mean the difference between a hospital stay (and even death). **Seeing a doctor immediately is crucial!** 

There are currently two pneumococcal vaccines that are licensed for use in the United States by the FDA: Prevnar13 (PCV13) & Pneumovax23 (PPSV23).

It is now recommended that adults ages 65 and older get both vaccines usually one year apart. You may require a PPSV23 booster every 5 years.

You should not get either vaccine if you had a life threatening reaction to either vaccine or any of their ingredients. Speak to your health care professional with questions.

Like all vaccines, both PPSV23 & PCV13 can have side effects. Some people have mild swelling, redness and soreness at the injection site. This goes away in a few days.

You can also lower your chances of getting pneumonia by staying away from people who have a cold and washing your hands often with soap and warm water.
