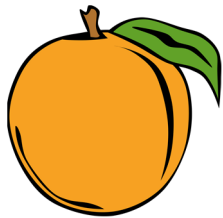

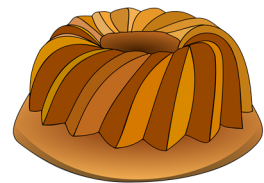

NEWS FROM MARION C. PRICE TRUST FUND

Summer is finally here and we are emerging from a pandemic that shut the world down. Many of us are ready to get out, and start enjoying all the things we took for granted, even going to the grocery store. Most of us were not prepared for all that has happened since March of 2020, but I would like to say people used creativity during this last year to celebrate milestones, and keep in contact with loved ones. If you are ready to venture out into the world once again, I have some ideas and information about things happening around the Schuylkill County area. Please remember to still use some care when gathering: masks may still be a good idea in certain situations and hand washing/hand sanitizing is always a good idea.

If you enjoy being outdoors, the county and surrounding area has several state parks to enjoy swimming, boating, fishing, picnicking, camping, biking, and more.

Tuscarora State Park – 687 Tuscarora Road, Barnesville

Locust Lake State Park – 220 Locust Lake Road, Barnesville

Swatara State Park- Pine Grove Township and Lebanon County near exit 100 off I 81

Although not a state park, Sweet Arrow Lake, located at 108 Clubhouse Road in Pine Grove, offers many of the same activities with the exception of swimming, which is not allowed.

Three area golf courses are available for the golfing enthusiast.

Hidden Valley- 1753 Panther Valley Road, Pine Grove

Mountain Valley- 1021 Brockton Mountain Drive, Barnesville

White Birch- 660 Tuscarora Park Road, Barnesville

If mini golf is more your speed, Heisler's Dairy Barn the Lewistown Valley offers 2 18-hole miniature golf courses, a driving range, batting cages, arcade, and country fresh ice cream.

Hope Hill Lavender Farm 2375 Panther Valley Road Pottsville offers tours of the farm on Saturdays in July and August. A \$5 tour will get you a taste of lavender at the end and an opportunity to purchase products made with lavender.

If you are interested in history, many towns have their own historical society to visit. The Schuylkill County Historical Society is located at 305 N. Centre St. in Pottsville. There you may gather a list of the many historical markers, monuments, and statues to visit in the area.

Coal mining has been a major industry in our area and some mines are still operational today. Pioneer Tunnel Coal Mine tour in Ashland will allow you to experience a little bit of this history as you ride an open mine car into the tunnel. A guide will inform you of the operations and how the coal was removed. It is a great tour, and allows a glimpse into the dangers and hard work the workers faced daily. Take a jacket along because it is chilly in the mine. The Henry Clay Steam Train will take you back in time on a three-quarter mile scenic ride. Call, (570) 875-3850 for ticket pricing and availability.

Coal Miners Statue and Park, located at the intersection of Routes 901 and 209 near Minersville, is dedicated to all those who labored in anthracite coal mines. Pennsylvania

Anthracite Miners Memorial is located in Girard Park at Washington and Main Streets in Shenandoah.

Several statues and memorials are located in Pottsville including John O'Hara on Centre St. just across from Trinity Episcopal Church. Ashland boasts the Mothers Memorial at the intersection of Hoffman Blvd and Center Streets, the world's only memorial dedicated to mothers.

America's oldest brewery is in our back yard at 420 Mahantongo St. Pottsville. Yuengling offers tours, which are free but online reservations are required. You may visit the museum and gift shop while you are there. Other historical attractions include the Tamaqua Railroad Station, which offers a restaurant and gift shop; Schuylkill County Courthouse, Pottsville; and the historic Old White Church, 189 Cemetery Rd. Ringtown, which is listed in the National Register of Historical Places. Church tours are available by calling (570) 889-3494.

This summer support your local fire companies by attending their block parties and carnivals. Enjoy fireworks, outdoor concerts, yard sales, bake sales, fundraisers, and other community events by checking the calendar of events in the local paper, or by visiting Schuylkill.org. Local wineries are often holding events and entertainment. Visit your local community pool to help you beat the heat. Knoebels Amusement Park is open and has free admission, free entertainment, shade trees, benches to relax on, mini golf, good food, ice cream and more!

Kenny Stehr and Sons farm located at 30 Kettle Road Pitman offers fresh vegetables, homemade baked goods, food, and ice cream Fridays and Saturdays all summer long. Join them on the farm in the beautiful Pitman valley for their Festivals including a Pickle Festival, July 16-17; Peach Festival, August 13-14; Sweet Corn Festival, August 27-28. Check out their Facebook page for details.

August will bring the Schuylkill County Fair, Aug. 2-7; Kielbasa Festival, Main St. Shenandoah, Aug. 21st from 11am – 5pm

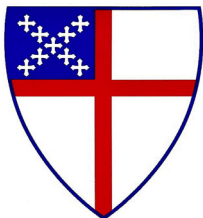
End the summer on Labor Day weekend with an entire town dedicated to grilling up the best burger you have ever had! The Taste of Hamburg hamburger festival, is Saturday Sept. 4th 10-6, in Hamburg. Admission is free to try burgers at over 30 hamburger stands, purchase handmade crafts, and local art, but parking is \$5. Sunday Sept. 5th travel to my neck of the woods for the Schuylkill County Wine Festival, held at the Hegins Park. Sample and purchase wine from local wineries, enjoy food and musical entertainment.

If it's too hot, or rainy, or you just want to wait for cooler weather to check out some indoor locations you may enjoy the following.

The Majestic Theater located at 209 N. Centre St. Pottsville offers art shows, comedy, musicals and more. Check out their website or Facebook page for more info.

Fighters Heaven, 58 Sculps Hill Rd. Orwigsburg, allows you to check out Muhammad Ali's training camp. Call, (570) 968-2961 for information to tour the camp where Ali trained for some of his biggest fights. There is no cost to check out this piece of Schuylkill County history but donations are accepted. There is also bowling at Pine Lanes Bowling Center in Pine Grove or Strike Zone Alleys in Pottsville. The Roller Roost in Pottsville has skating and laser tag. They also have a roller derby team. Call (570) 628-4032 for price and information.

As restrictions are lifted and people want to get out, please consider volunteering to drive someone to the doctor or to run errands. I am looking for people to volunteer to give a ride to parishioners if needed. Please call me in the office at (570) 621-3220 with questions and to volunteer. I look forward to hearing from you!
