

From Fr. Tim's Desk

"Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them." Acts 2:3

When I was a boy scout, many years ago, everybody wanted to be the ONE who built the fire. There was always a friendly competition. Who could build the best fire? What kind of a fire was it going to be? What kind of tinder would we use? How were we going to light it? What kind of fuel would we use? But once the fire was started, the competitiveness died down a bit and you got to the business at hand, whether it be cooking a meal or just enjoying each other's fellowship around the campfire.

The ancient Greeks believed that fire - - along with earth, water, and air - - was one of the four essential elements of the world. Today we know the world is a bit more complicated than that; with over 100 different elements of matter that can be combined in any number of ways. But fire . . . fire is not one of them. Fire is not anything at all. It is simply a chemical reaction that takes place between a fuel source and oxygen; a reaction that takes place when the fuel source reaches its ignition point, a reaction that releases energy in the form of heat and light, a reaction that TRANSFORMS. Fire is a reaction that transforms matter from one state into another.

As we enter the season of Pentecost and the coming of the Holy Spirit, is there any question about WHO the fire builder will be? How will He go about it? What fuel will he use? How will He go about setting the elements in place to create a reaction that will transform us from one state of being into another? In his Letter to the Corinthians, St. Paul tells us that the fuel for the fire is already in place. We have all been given gifts of the Spirit – wisdom, knowledge, faith, healing, working miracles, prophecy, discernment and interpretation. All of them set into motion, activated, ignited, by one Spirit, the Holy Spirit, the Spirit of God. And the flames leap higher and higher, completing the task at hand, doing the work that God intended them to do.

On the Day of Pentecost, the disciples of Christ became apostles of Christ, no longer students of the Word, but rather doers of the Word. In this season of Pentecost may we all be open to the Spirit and allow it to kindle the flame that will ignite the gifts we have been given. May we be open to the Spirit and allow the Master fire builder to TRANSFORM us into the new creations He intended us to be from the foundation of the world.
