As we wait with the disciples for the rush of a violent wind and tongues of flame to rest upon each of us may we too realize that it is indeed the Spirit that moves each and every one of us to bring good news to the poor, to proclaim release to the captives, to bring sight to the blind, and to let the oppressed go free. May we too be the Lord's faithful witnesses to the ends of the earth.

NEWS FROM MARION C. PRICE TRUST FUND

DIABETES is a chronic disease that occurs when the pancreas does not produce enough insulin or when the body cannot effectively use the insulin it produces. Insulin is a hormone that regulates blood sugar.

Type 1 was previously known as insulin-dependent, juvenile or childhood-onset. It is an auto immune disease. Type 2 is increasingly being diagnosed in children because of childhood obesity.

In Type 1, insulin is not produced by the body but in Type 2 the pancreas is usually producing enough insulin but the body cannot use the insulin effectively, a condition called insulin resistance. After several years the insulin production decreases.

The risk of developing Diabetes Type 2 increases as people age or gain weight. The more fatty tissue you have, the more resistant your cells become to insulin. As you get older you tend to exercise less, lose muscle mass and gain weight, may have acquired high blood pressure, have high triglycerides and have smoked for years.

Fasting blood sugars of 126 or higher is an indicator of Diabetes. A normal blood sugar is less than 100 when fasting. But in most healthy people sugar levels are even lower. Prediabetes means you have blood levels that are higher than normal but not high enough to be called Diabetes, blood glucose levels of 100-125 after an overnight fast. Studies have shown that people that have been determined as Pre-diabetic can lower their risk of developing Diabetes by losing 5-7% of their body weight through diet and increased physical activity.

Diabetes is not contagious but if you have family diagnosed then you are predisposed or at risk to developing Diabetes.

Over time, Diabetes can damage the heart, blood vessels, eyes, kidneys and nerves. High blood glucose levels over time can lead to increased deposits of fatty materials inside the blood vessel walls. These deposits may affect blood flow and increase the chance of clogging and hardening of blood vessels. Blood vessels of the eyes and nerves are extremely small, glucose injures the walls of these tiny blood vessels that nourish them. High levels of blood glucose causes the filters in the tiny blood vessels in the kidneys to overwork and eventually stop working.

Stopping tobacco use is very important to avoid complications of Diabetes. Smoking increases blood glucose, blood pressure and heart rate. It reduces the amount of oxygen supplies to the body, causes narrowing of blood vessels, increases cholesterol levels and makes it hard for the body to absorb calcium.

Eating a healthy diet of between 3-5 servings of fruit and vegetables a day and reducing sugar and saturated fats intake will help maintain blood sugars within normal limits.

Taking care of your feet is one of the most important things you can do when you have been diagnosed with Diabetes. Check your feet every day: look at the bottoms and between your toes, look for cuts, calluses, scratches, blisters, bruises, swelling, rashes and color changes, areas of hot or cold. Report any of these to your doctor immediately. The more you learn how to manage your meals to maintain your blood sugar within normal levels the healthier you will be. It is also very important to be able to recognize what other factors affect your blood sugar, as well as signs of hypo and hyperglycemia.

Signs of hypo or low blood sugar – sweatiness, hunger, confusion, headache, nervousness, dizziness, drowsiness and rapid heart rate.

Signs of hyper or high blood sugar – thirst, frequent urination, fatigue, weakness, dry mouth, sleepiness, blurred vision, pain or tingling in feet or legs.

The goal of Diabetes management is to keep levels of blood glucose; blood pressure and cholesterol as close to the normal range as safely possible to prevent complications.

PENNSYLVANIA PROPERTY TAX OR RENT REBATE PROGRAM - The Property

Tax/Rebate Program benefits eligible Pennsylvanians age 65 and older; widows and widowers age 50 and older; and people with disabilities age 18 and older. Take a little time to look at your income. You may be eligible for a rebate.

Homeowner's annual income - \$0 - \$35,000 and renter's annual income \$0 - \$15,000.

Applicants exclude one-half of social security income. The deadline to apply for a rebate for taxes or rent paid in 2012 is June 30, 2013. Application forms and assistance are available at **<u>NO COST</u>** from the Department of Revenue's District Offices, Office of Senior Services, Senior Centers and State Legislator's offices.
