Flu Vaccine – Will be available very soon. It is the best protection against the flu this season.

Flu vaccination can reduce flu illnesses, doctor visits and missed work and school, as well as prevent flu-related hospitalizations and deaths. It is especially important to get the vaccine if you, or someone you live with, or someone you care for is at high risk for complications of the flu.

A flu vaccine is needed every season for two reasons. First, the body's immune system response from the vaccination declines over time, so an annual vaccine is needed for optimal protection. Second, because flu vaccines are constantly changing, the formulation of the flu vaccine is reviewed each year and sometimes updated to keep up with changing viruses. For the best protection, everyone 6 months and older should get vaccinated annually.

It takes about two weeks after the vaccination for antibodies to develop in the body and provide protection against influenza infection. In the meantime, you are still at risk for getting the flu. That's why it's better to get vaccinated early in the fall, so you are protected before the flu begins spreading in your community. However, as long as the flu virus is circulating, vaccination should continue throughout the flu season. Flu season usually peaks between December and February, but activity can last as late as May, so it is never too late to get the vaccine.

Talk to your health care provider about the vaccine if you have: a severe allergy to chicken eggs or any other ingredients in the vaccine, a history of severe reaction to a flu vaccination, a moderate-to-severe illness with a fever or have a history of Guillian-Barre Syndrome.

Motor Vehicle Registration – Under this program, certain retired individuals can register their car or truck for an annual \$10 fee, instead of the usual \$36 or \$54. You are eligible if you are retired on a fixed income that does not exceed \$19,200. You can get the necessary forms from local notaries public, the Office of Senior Services or local Department of Motor Vehicles.

Charitable Giving – Legitimate charities need your help. Before giving, however, you should make sure that a charity deserves your contribution by following these tips for informed giving.

- Know your charity. Do not be tricked by an impressive-sounding name or one that is similar to a well-known charity.
- Know how your money will be spent. Find out how much of your donation actually goes to helping people and program services, as opposed to fundraising and administrative expenses. You may obtain this information by calling Pennsylvania's Bureau of Charitable Organizations, toll-free at 1-800-732-0999.
- Know your charity's goals.
- Telephone solicitors. Because telephone solicitations are typically conducted by paid professional find-raisers on behalf of the charity, ask the caller if he/she is paid or a volunteer and how much the charity receives of each dollar donated. Never give your credit card information over the phone.
- Door-to-door solicitations. *Demand Identification!* Do not feel pressured by the person at the door. The best practice is to mail your donation directly to the charity.
- Do not be pressured into giving. Take time to think about your donation. Highpressure tactics and sob stories often are the signs of unscrupulous operators.
- Unordered merchandise. You have <u>no</u> obligation to pay for greeting cards, tickets, advertising, merchandise or any other item you never asked for, nor are you obligated to return them.
- Method of payment. If you decide to contribute, pay by check. Make check payable out to the charity, not to a company or the individual collecting the donations and send it directly to the charity. Never pay cash or use your credit card number in response to a request by a stranger.

Energy Assistance – If you own or rent a residence and meet income requirements, you may be able to get help paying winter heating bills through the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP).

LIHEAP is operated by the PA Department of Public Welfare but no lien is placed on your home and you are not required to pay the assistance back.

You do not need to be on public assistance or have any unpaid heating bills to qualify.

Income limits and funding availability are determined annually.
