Shingles- is a viral infection that causes a painful rash or it can cause intense pain with minimal rash. Although shingles can occur anywhere in your body, it most often appears as a single stripe of blisters that wraps around either the left or the right side of your torso.

Shingles are caused by the varicella-zoster virus – the same virus that causes chickenpox. After you have had chickenpox, the virus lies inactive in nerve tissue near your spinal cord and brain. Years later, the virus may rear its ugly head as shingles.

The reason for shingles is unclear. But, it may be due to lowered immunity to infections as you grow older. It is most common in older adults and in people who have weakened immune systems.

The signs and symptoms of shingles are pain, burning, numbness or tingling, sensitivity to touch, a red rash that begins a few days after the pain with fluid filled blisters that break apart and crust over (which usually affect only one side of your body) and itching. Some people also experience fever, headache, sensitivity to light and fatigue.

Pain is usually the first symptom of shingles. For some, it can be mistaken for a symptom of problems affecting the heart, lungs or kidneys. Some people experience shingles pain without ever developing the rash and for some shingles pain (post herpetic neuralgia) continues long after the blisters have cleared.

Contact your doctor immediately if you suspect shingles; if the rash is widespread and painful; if someone in your family has a weakened immune system (due to cancer, medications or chronic illness); and especially if the rash appears near your eye, if this is left untreated it can lead to permanent eye damage.

Until your shingles blisters scab over, you are contagious and should avoid physical contact with anyone who hasn't yet had the chickenpox or the chickenpox vaccine, especially people with weakened immune systems, pregnant women and newborns. (Chickenpox can be dangerous for some people).

Two vaccines may help prevent shingles: Zostavax and Shingrix.

Zostavax, approved in 2006, is recommended for people age 60 or older. It has been shown to offer protection against shingles for about 5 years.

Shingrix was approved in 2017 and recommended for people age 50 and over. Studies show that protection against shingles lasts beyond 5 years. It is a non-living vaccine given in two doses with two to six months between doses.

The most common side effects of either shingles vaccine are redness, pain, tenderness, swelling and itching at the injection site and headaches.

As with the chickenpox vaccine, the shingles vaccine doesn't guarantee you won't get shingles but it will likely reduce the course and severity of the disease and reduce your risk of post herpetic neuralgia.

The majority of the cost of the vaccines may be covered by your insurance plan.

Flu – Most people who get the flu have mild illness (fever, cough, sore throat, body aches and fatigue), and will not need medical care. Adults 65 years of age and older and children younger than 5 are at highest risk for complications. People in these age groups are more likely to get flu complications that can result in hospitalization and sometimes death. Pneumonia, bronchitis, sinus and ear infections are examples of flu-related complications. The flu can also make chronic health problems worse.

Flu vaccines are offered in many locations, including doctor's offices, clinics, health departments and pharmacies. Most health insurance plans cover the cost of recommended vaccines.

In addition to getting a flu shot, it's important to practice healthy habits, such as covering coughs with your arm instead of your hand, washing hands often and avoiding people who are sick. If you are 65 and older and develop flu symptoms, seek medical advice quickly. The CDC (Centers for Disease Control) recommends rapid treatment with an influenza anti-viral medication.

Anti-viral drugs are prescription medications that fight against the flu in your body. They are best when used within 48 hours of getting sick and can mean the difference between having milder illness instead of very serious illness that could result in a hospital stay.

Medicare – Health and prescription drug plans make changes each year – things like cost, coverage and what providers and pharmacies are in their networks. October 15 – December 7 is called the open enrollment period, when people can change their health plans and prescription drug plans for the following year to better meet their needs. Even if you are satisfied with premiums and coverage this year it is recommended that you review your options during this open enrollment period. By comparing plans you may find lower premiums and extra benefits for 2019.
