Social Security Benefit

Here are some interesting facts about extra Social Security Benefits that former military personnel will be eligible for. If you aren't aware of this benefit, it could be worth checking out especially if you are already drawing Social Security. This is not just for retirees, but also for anyone who has served in the military. Please share this with anyone who has had active duty service prior to January 2002 and planning for retirement. This includes ARC (Guard and Reserve) who served on Active Duty for training (but not IADT/AFTP).

Basically, you may qualify for a higher social security payment because of your military service, for active duty anytime from 1940 through 2001 (the program was cancelled in January 2002). Up to \$1,200 per year of earnings credit (see website: www.ssa.gov/retir2/military.htm) credited at time of application. This could make a substantial difference in social security monthly payments upon your retirement.

You must bring your DD-214 (s) to the Social Security Office...and, you must ask for this benefit to receive it!!

Wind in my hair!! (all 20 of 'em!)

My daughter and wife collaborated on an absolutely awesome Christmas gift for me last year. I have always spoken about how I have flown in just about everything except an open-cockpit biplane. Well...they saw to that!!! They bought me a half hour, full acrobatic flight in a vintage 1942 Boeing N2S-5 Stearman in original Navy paint scheme.

We were originally scheduled to fly in May but the



weather was bad but they were in Pittsburgh again in September. We waited for the ceiling to rise a bit and up we went!!

The company is Warbird Sky Adventures out of Gallatin, TN. They advertise in most large city newspapers and their website is: www.warbirdskyventures.com

They fly VA, PA, OH, MD, MI, MN, MO, SD, KY, TN, TX, LA and CO. Their season goes from Jan thru Nov with the closed-cockpit North American AT-6 and the open-cockpit Boeing N2S-5. For a half hour we did loops, rolls, wingovers and most anything we wanted to do over the airport with my wife and daughter watching from below. The pilot was an ole Navy man and he saw my leather flight jacket like he had on and we became best buds. He was an ex-Navy flight engineer and does this part-time during the season...fly around the country giving rides. Boy, some folks have it rough eh? For an additional \$50 I got an in-flight video with sound.

Cameras are mounted in the nose, wing and tail and continually alternate views from preflight, during the flight and post flight.

During the preflight the parachute brief goes like this...If we have engine failure, we are slow enough that we will find a grass field somewhere and put her down there. If we have fire (it is a fabric covered plane) then we get out of here!!! Small fire we undo our seatbelt, step out on the wing and let go. If we have a major catastrophic fire, we undo the seatbelt and we go inverted and fall out of the plane quickly. I took that flight 4 months ago and my feet still haven't touched ground!. He demonstrated to me how the old pilots could listen to the wind in the wires to determine if they were about to stall during dog-fights and maneuvers. You also are watching the fabric on the wings flutter, then they would just nose-over, pick up some airspeed and fly again. Sooooooo cool!!



So....now that you have the info, check it out, go take your flight and we'll compare notes at the Fall Muster.
