Centralized Naval Reserve Web Site Goes "Live"

NEW ORLEANS (NNS) -- The Naval Reserve transition to a new way of doing business on the World Wide Web is on track and nearing completion. The new Web site will replace all existing Naval Reserve Web sites with a two-tiered public and private network.

The public side is accessible to anyone through the Internet and contains basic public information. The private side is only accessible by members of the Naval Reserve via a secure login.

All current Naval Reserve public Web sites were disestablished April 1. The new Web site employs a content management solution (CMS) and is designed to be user friendly. The new URL for all Naval Reserve commands is <u>http://reserves.navy.mil</u> Note: "Login" button for the private side is located in the upper right hand corner of the page.
